Thinking Strategically

- Framed Animal Health and Welfare 2020: A strategy for Animal Agriculture in Canada
- Canadian Pork Council flags animal health as part of its strategic plan and there is considerable alignment in the outcomes.

 CPC includes these outcomes in our input into the new agriculture policy framework and the CFIA-led Animal and Plant Health Strategy

- Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Pigs
 2014
- ACA, part of the CQA program is being updated to reflect the code requirements.
- Animal care will be given greater exposure with the release of PigCare in 2018
- Swine Innovation Pork: Swine Cluster 1-2
 - Groups such as the Prairie Swine Centre play a big role in getting the message out to producers
