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
Perspective

- Growth promotion
 - Exploring removal of growth promotion claims

Veterinary oversight

- Willing to explore increased veterinary oversight
 - Address availability of veterinarians
 - Ensure timely and convenient availability of products
 - Ensure cost competitiveness
 - Address cross-jurisdictional complications



Direction

- Support CgFarad
- Expand CIPARS
 - More farms and more production stages
 - Retail testing that addresses imports
 - Improve use data
- Recognize current CQA program
- Maintain veterinary access to ELDU
- Consider US "dosage ranges"
