# AMU/AMR - Stewardship

#### **Purpose**

Positioning of the role of animal agriculture stakeholders in antimicrobial stewardship.

#### **Outcome**

- Antimicrobial Stewardship in Food Animals in Canada published in 2016
- Included in NCCID report on AMR
- Being utilized in pan-Canadian plan development



## Emerging Issues – Market Access

 Purpose – to use the 2014 Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea outbreak as a case study to develop recommendations

#### Outcomes:

- "Domestic Market Access in the 2014 Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea Outbreak" published in 2016
- Utilized to expand recommendations to be useful for all commodities. "Preparing for an Emerging Issue" was published in late 2016



# Farmed Animal Health and Welfare 2020

- Strategy implemented in 2015
- Current focus development of stakeholder reporting of activities impacting progress on strategic outcomes and priorities
- Long term objective a national report demonstrating activities and progress
- Survey techniques and process being developed



# Transportation of Cull Dairy Cows

The study is facilitated through UBC as part of a PhD program – Dr. David Fraser lead

#### **Outcomes**

- A description of the extent and nature of transport of cull dairy cows from Canadian farms
- Develop an understanding of the welfare problems associated with cull dairy cows
- Develop a draft statement of best practices



# **Monitoring Progress**

- 8 advisory statements
- 70 recommendations
- 51 Recommendations progressing or completed
