BEING A FARMER IS INCREASINGLY STRESSFUL

- ➤ ≈ 50% experience distress
- ➤ High rate of suicide
- ➤ All Regions are impacted
- ➤ All commodites are affected

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CAUSES OF STRESS

- > Burnout
- > Health Problems
- ➤ Loss of Physical Integrity
- > Transfer of a Difficult Inheritance
- **>** Globalization
- ➤ Performance Pressure
- Increasing Level of Indebtedness
- ➤ Lower Margins ...

PRODUCER REACTIONS

- Denial and isolation
- ➤ Refusal to consult (≈ 20% consult)
- ▶ Lack of Time
- > Looking for fast and effective relief
- ➤ A belief that no one outside the agricultural field could possibly understand



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BECOME A SENTRY TO PREVENT SUICIDE

- > Training adapted to agricultural world
 - o 7 hours/training
 - Variable cost
- > 45 Trainers
- Sentries
 - Chosen for their closeness to farmers: veterinarians, agronomists, accountants, account managers, inseminators, counsellors, farmers, etc.
 - o Likely to receive confidences from the producers



THE SENTRIES' ROLE

- ➤ Identify vulnerable individuals
- ➤ Check for suicidal ideas
- ➤ Encourage asking for help
- Send the information to the designated intervenor
- > Respect their limits

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WHY CREATE A NETWORK?

- ➤ Isolation and lack of social support
- ➤ Ignorance of health resources
- > Farmer's difficulty in asking for help
- > Important to react in an appropriate way

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REALISTIC EXPECTATIONS OF A SENTRY'S INTERVENTION

- > Allow the individual
 - To express what they are going through
 - To recognize and respect their pain
 - o To be valued
- ➤ Encourage the steps to be taken by the person in distress

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A SENTRY'S OPERATING RULES

> Act within the framework of his usual job

➤ Be in regular contact with farmers

Question the farmer about his situation and his plans

➤ Maintain confidentiality

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SUPPORT FOR SENTRIES



- > Preservation of anonymity
- ➤ Linked to designated intervenor
- ➤ Kept well-informed by the trainers



EXPECTED RESULTS

- > Fight taboos
- ➤ Talk about distress, mental illness, professional burnout
- Reduce the number of farmers living with distress
- ➤ Lower the rate of suicide among farmers



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PROJECT TO BE COMPLETED ...

- Consolidation of the network of nearby workers
- ➤ Improvement of the agricultural knowledge of health professionals
 - ✓ Ordre des psychologues du Québec (psychologists)
 - ✓ CISSS
- Preventative Action
 - ✓ Promote work/life balance
 - ✓ Replacement workers to offer periods of respite
- > Participation of agricultural bodies and partners

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
