FARMED ANIMAL HEALTH AND WELFARE 2020

The original National Farmed Animal Health and Welfare Strategy (2009) was designed to provide strategic direction to farmed animal industry stakeholders to 2015. The renewed Strategy includes revisions to the strategic outcomes and identifies priorities to provide direction for stakeholders to 2020.

The most significant advancement for the 2020 Strategy is the engagement of all stakeholders in contributing to the measurement of progress on the strategic outcomes and sharing the responsibility to report on the achievements of those outcomes in their own words.

MANITOBA PORK

Manitoba Pork is an organization that works with governments and industry stakeholders to deliver programs to Manitoba's pork producers. Programs include quality assurance and food safety, animal care, human resources and training, environmental stewardship, swine production research, promotions and consumer education, public affairs and international market development.

SAFE FOOD

Manitoba Pork has administered the Canadian Quality Assurance programs on Manitoba hog farms and collaborated to improve national food safety assurance programs. Moreover, Manitoba Pork has implemented disease surveillance programs and hosts a disease status information sharing portal, the *Manitoba Coordinated Disease Response*, to help producers understand disease and responses to it. Finally, Manitoba Pork has, independently and collaboratively, worked with producers to encourage improved management practices and medication use practices.





ANIMAL WELFARE

Manitoba Pork works to help producers understand and implement the Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Pigs through collaborations with producers and veterinarians, hosting seminars, and developing educational tools to communicate best practices. Additionally, Manitoba Pork has maintained a close relationship with the Chief Veterinary Officer to collaborate on preventing animal welfare issues in rare occurrences.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Manitoba Pork has been involved in delivering the Canada-West Swine Health Intelligence Network and the Canadian Swine Health Intelligence Network to monitor disease trends and to implement other disease surveillance programs for diseases detrimental to production. Many of the emergency management activities focus on building disease response plans, training to respond to emergencies, and communicating best practices to producers.
