• Dr. David Waltner-Toews – University Professor Emeritus, University of Guelph

While trade has always been important for Canadian agriculture, agricultural and food systems have, since the 1980s, increasingly been caught up in what have been called International Agri-Food Trade Networks (IATNs). Furthermore, traditional concerns of food animal agriculture such as animal health, welfare, and food safety, have become entangled in issues of ecological fragility, and global political, economic, and climatic instability. The questions we asked in the twentieth century, the way we framed issues of risk, and kinds of science we required, are inadequate to sustain a resilient agri-food system in the twenty-first.
